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# Community Consultation – Our Aims and Objectives

## 1. Purpose of Report

1.1 This report presents and analyses the response to the recent Neighbourhood Plan consultation carried out in the Parish of Martock on the Aims and Objectives of the Plan. The report also makes recommendations (from page 11) on the Aims and Objectives that should be adopted for the Martock Neighbourhood Plan.

## 2. Introduction

2.1 Neighbourhood planning in Martock has been in progress since the autumn of 2016. The process is being ‘steered’ by a Steering Group of local people appointed by the Martock Parish Council. The Group’s project plan and timetable and where they are at, is summarised in the table below.

2.2 Following a process of analysing the messages from the Local Evidence<sup>1</sup> that had been gathered for the Plan, the Steering Group, at its meeting on the 9<sup>th</sup> October 2017, approved a set of draft aims and objectives for the Neighbourhood Plan to be shared with the community of the Parish for comment. It was agreed to carry out this consultation at a public event and exhibition on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2017 (to coincide with the monthly farmers’ market in Martock) and via the website<sup>2</sup>. The consultation period was set as two weeks up until the 30<sup>th</sup> October 2017.

## 3. Consultation Stage 3

3.1 The purpose of this stage of the community engagement programme (C3 on project plan above) was to:

- share a draft set of aims and objectives for the Martock Neighbourhood Plan
- explore the themes and priorities for neighbourhood planning policies
- invite suggestions for specific neighbourhood planning policies

3.2 The Steering Group decided that the best method for doing this was to hold an exhibition in the centre of Martock, at Market House, to display the draft aims and objectives and allow local

people to view them together and share reactions and responses. For those that could not attend in person, the consultation was also carried out via the neighbourhood planning website.

- 3.3 As is now 'established practice' for engaging with the community on the Neighbourhood Plan, the event took place at the same time and day (Saturday) as the monthly farmers' market was taking place in Martock (at the nearby shopping precinct).

#### 4. Organising the Event/Exhibition

- 4.1 Members of the Steering Group shared the responsibility for organising the consultation event. At its meeting in September 2017, a list of required resources and a task list was agreed.

##### Publicity

- 4.2 To ensure that everyone was aware of the consultation event, the event was publicised by using the usual means of disseminating information about the Neighbourhood Plan i.e. by email to the NP Focus Group (circa 130 members at October 2017) and Facebook (see appendix B). An article was placed in the village magazine, the Leveller. Notices were placed around the villages in various places in the week preceding the event. A-frames to promote the event and identify its location were used on the day.

##### Content

- 4.3 A set of exhibition boards comprising the **draft aims and objectives**, on a topic by topic basis was the focus of the exhibition. Members of the Steering Group were on hand to encourage members of the public to express support by using the coloured dots available, or opposition by writing a 'cross' against anything they disagreed with, and to contribute their own thoughts on the objectives of the Neighbourhood Plan and any other comments by using 'post-it' notes.

#### 5. Attendance

- 5.1 49 persons 'signed in' at the consultation event, although some 'signatures' were for couples and family groups. It is estimated that around 70 persons in total attended and viewed the exhibition panels.
- 5.2 In terms of residency, the breakdown of attendees was approximately 72% from Martock and 28% from other settlements and parts of the Parish



## 6. Response and Interpretation

6.1 Not everybody used the sticky dots or the 'post-its' that were made available to express their opinion. There was plenty of conversation between visitors and the members of the Steering Group, during which many valid opinions were expressed. The dot counts for each of the draft objectives can be seen in the table below. There were no expressions of disagreement with the draft objectives. The written comments that were made on post-it notes have been transcribed and set out topic by topic in Appendix A to this report.

## 7. Draft Aims and Objectives

- 7.1 Based on the very positive response received at the Consultation Event, the draft aims and objectives that were offered for consultation appear to have been a very reasonable reflection of the community's hopes and wishes for the future development of the Parish of Martock. The implications of the response, on a topic by topic basis, have been analysed to understand what it means for the Neighbourhood Plan. The conclusions reached are summarised below.
- 7.2 The purpose of the analysis that follows is to help refine the aims and objectives to make them effective as the basis for the next stage of plan-making. i.e. policy writing. The opportunity to separate out those matters that cannot be addressed by a planning policy but are, nevertheless important to the community has also been taken. These are listed as "community actions" that should be referred to the Parish Council for consideration.

### Natural Environment

#### *What the dots tell us:*

- 7.3 The draft objectives are generally acceptable to local people. It seems clear that that parishioners wish to see the natural environment protected and looked after. There is strong support for reducing, not worsening, flood risk.

#### *Summary of Community Comments:*

- 7.4 The feedback on the natural environment topic was affected significantly by the helpful, pre-prepared, contribution of the Flooding Group. The Group submitted a series of flood-prevention-related suggestions that attracted attention and expressions of support from many attendees.
- 7.5 Several messages come through from the suggestions. Increased flooding is a real fear and measures should be taken to ensure that the current flood risk is reduced. Development should not be allowed to increase flood risk. Policies in the Neighbourhood Plan should ensure that development does not take place in the wrong area and flood mitigation measures are an integral part of any development. Aside from flood matters, we are informed that the community should be playing a more pro-active role in the management and well-being of local

countryside and the natural environment. Access to the countryside could be improved. Fields of solar panels would not be welcomed.

*Revised Aims and Objectives:*

- 7.6 The aims and objectives seem to cover the scope of people's concerns and interests. The policies that emanate, need to cover adequately the community's concerns about flood risk and the impact that development can have on it.

*Community Actions:*

- 7.7 The following 'suggestions' on non-planning matters had sufficient community support for them to be referred to the Parish Council for its further consideration and action.
- *The farming community should be urged to adopt more responsible agricultural practices*
  - *There is scope for the community to be involved in the management and well-being of local nature reserves*
  - *Environmental education for local school-children should be encouraged and supported*
  - *Community horticulture should be encouraged*

## Built Environment and Heritage

*What the dots tell us:*

- 7.8 Local heritage is important and must have a significant influence on local planning decisions and strategy. Development should be appropriate in character. Green spaces within the settlement areas should be protected. Small-scale renewable energy generation installations may be acceptable.

*Summary of Community Comments:*

- 7.9 There is a concern that infrastructure cannot cope with major new development. Any new development that takes place should complement the sense of being a village and the character of the area.

*Revised Aims and Objectives:*

- 7.10 The aims and objectives seem to cover the scope of people's concerns and interests.

## Housing

*What the dots tell us:*

- 7.11 Housing development should focus on meeting local needs and what local people can afford.

*Summary of Community Comments:*

- 7.12 There is little enthusiasm for new housing development. Any development that does take place should be within the confines of the built-up area. Housing should be designed to match existing styles and scale. Sufficient off-street parking should be included in new development.

*Revised Aims and Objectives:*

- 7.13 The aims and objectives seem to cover the scope of people's concerns and interests.

## Local Economy

*What the dots tell us:*

- 7.14 Reliable high speed electronic communication is important. Growth in the local economy is important and should be supported.

*Summary of Community Comments:*

- 7.15 More industrial areas aren't needed. It is preferable to make better use of existing business and employment areas.

*Revised Aims and Objectives:*

- 7.16 The objectives should also relate to enhancements of and development within existing industrial and commercial areas.

#### *Community Actions:*

7.17 The following 'suggestions' on non-planning matters had sufficient community support for them to be referred to the Parish Council for its further consideration and action.

- *Martock should be better promoted as a place for business*
- *Martock's local products should be show-cased more often*

### Transport and Transport

#### *What the dots tell us:*

7.18 Measures that provide more safe walking and cycling opportunities are supported. On-street parking is a problem to be solved. Public transport services need to be better.

#### *Summary of Community Comments:*

7.19 The bus services are inadequate. They don't operate early and late in the day and some destinations are not adequately covered. Children should be encouraged to walk to school.

#### *Revised Aims and Objectives:*

7.20 The aims and objectives seem to cover the scope of people's concerns and interests.

#### *Community Actions:*

7.21 The following 'suggestions' on non-planning matters had sufficient community support for them to be referred to the Parish Council for its further consideration and action.

- *It would encourage public transport use if bus services were more relevant to local need (several suggestions have been made)*
- *Speed limits should be reviewed in the interest of road safety*

### Community Wellbeing

#### *What the dots tell us:*

7.22 More services delivered locally would be welcomed. Current services and facilities should be protected.

#### *Summary of Community Comments:*

7.23 The surgery and pharmacy are important local facilities and should not be lost. There are concerns about the capacity of local services to cope with population changes.

#### *Revised Aims and Objectives:*

7.24 The aims and objectives generally cover the scope of people's concerns and interests, but should also reflect concern that existing facilities and services will not cope with changing demands.

### Leisure and Recreation

#### *What the dots tell us:*

7.25 Current facilities should be protected. More facilities that meet local demands would be welcomed.

#### *Summary of Community Comments:*

7.26 A swimming pool would be a welcome addition to local recreation facilities, as would other facilities that can be enjoyed by an ageing population. The footpath network needs improving, including the access to the Recreation Ground.

#### *Revised Aims and Objectives:*

7.27 The aims and objectives generally seem to cover the scope of people's concerns and interests. Ensure it is recognised that the interests and demands of different age groups will differ.

#### *Community Actions:*

7.28 The following 'suggestions' on non-planning matters had sufficient community support for them to be referred to the Parish Council for its further consideration and action.

- *A local swimming pool would be welcomed*
- *Recreation facilities and opportunities should be improved*

## 8. Next Steps

- 8.1 Based on the response to the consultation, the Steering Group should consider a series of modifications and refinements to the Neighbourhood Plan's draft aims and objectives before referring them to Martock Parish Council for adoption. An adopted set of aims and objectives will enable the Steering Group to develop the planning policies of the Neighbourhood Plan.

## 9. Revisions and Recommendations

- 9.1 As a result of the analysis of the responses received at the Community Consultation Event in October 2017, several minor changes and additions to the draft set of aims and objectives were recommended. These are shown in red below. **Following discussion at the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group on 6<sup>th</sup> November 2017, the following have been adopted as the aims and objectives of the Martock Neighbourhood Plan:**
